DETENTION POLICY TO BE GIVEN TRIAL RUN DURING FOURTH QUARTER

Gone are the days of knuckle raps with a ruler, five swats for an unruly child who must grab his ankles and Dunce stools positioned in the corner with a cap waiting to be worn by an offending soul. You'll not hear a CPLS teacher say,

"O vain futile frivolous boy. Smirking. I won't have it. I won't have it. Go find the headmaster and ask him to beat you within an inch of your life. And say please."

Thankfully, ours are not the kinds of students that provoke a teacher to make such a drastic demand. Even more thankfully, our teachers are not ones who believe that beating a child within an inch of his life is a remedy for wrong behavior. However, we are in a constant training process – training of ourselves and our students – as we attempt to teach kids to pursue respect for authority, deference toward peers and general self-control. From the pulling of cards to the issuing of demerits, most students need very little to remind them that they have strayed from the expectations of school or classroom. Simple corrective steps go a long way for the vast majority of our students.

Discipline is much more of an art than it is a science, and we are in constant pursuit of the best and most equitable policies and procedures for the running of a school that is freed to focus upon the productive use of time and energy for the advancement of the kingdom of God. Please know that the

CPLS' new Lions Share program is now taking orders!

Attached to the newsletter is an enrollment form and an order form. Orders with payment are due in the office or the tuition box each Monday by 9 a.m. and orders will be ready to pick up or be sent home with your student on Friday.

WHAT IS LION'S SHARE?

It is a new fund raising program for CPLS. It's called Lions Share, and it's a fund raising program that works while you shop.

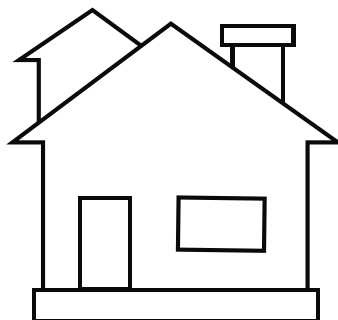

faculty understands that right relationship is the best foundation for implementation of right rules, and while that is not always achieved with all students, it is certainly a high priority. The faculty also knows that the issuance of a simple demerit or two has not been as effective as was hoped when the policy was first implemented several years ago. It is believed that something needs to be done to put some teeth into the current policy and make receipt of a demerit a more serious matter. Making the consequences more proximate to the offenses appears to be one remedy worth exploring.

During the fourth quarter of this school year, CP-LS will engage in a trial run with the use of detention for middle and high school students. We believe a detention policy is necessary because of the apparent lack of importance that some of our students place upon the receiving of a demerit. It is not our goal to be harsh or unbalanced in the administering of discipline, but we do believe it is incumbent upon us to promote an environment at Cair Paravel that enables the majority of students to have a cooperative, productive and disciplined environment for learning.

Most of the area schools have some form of a policy of detention, as do a good number of our Christian and private school counterparts. I am sure many of you attended schools that had detention policies, and I happened to be somewhat of a connoisseur of detention hall myself when in high school.

We plan to begin a policy during the fourth quarter that calls for a detention for every three demerits received from March 7th forward. Students will still be subject to the current aspects of the policy that is in place, but they will also be required to serve a 1 ½ hour detention on Wednesday afternoons from 3:40 to 5:10 for every three demerits received. Detention will be a no talk environment in which the students will be allowed to do homework, but not allowed to interact with others or be tutored in subjects. Parents will be notified in advance of a detention period so that arrangements can be made for that day.

Our motivation for this is to reduce the number of distractions that are encountered from day to day, and – as stated – to hopefully begin to put some teeth into a demerit policy that has not had the desired effectiveness over the years. As I have stated, we do not intend to change our current demerit policy. We simply want to make the consequences for receiving demerits more proximate to the violations so that students will consider their behavior more seriously and the level of cooperation and productivity can be enhanced.

The faculty agrees that this policy is one that the vast majority of our students will seldom if ever be subjected to as most of them do strive to be cooperative and obedient. Hopefully this will serve to benefit those well mannered students as their teachers are freed to invest even more time in education and less time in dealing with behavioral issues.

CPLS utilizes Family Financial Needs Assessment (FFNA), an objective third-party, to process the applications and assess each family's financial situation. FFNA accepts applications on-line or via USPS. Based on the processing times for each type of application and our goal to communicate awards to families by Friday, April 22, we have established the following deadlines:

Regular Processing, USPS, application & tax return must be received by FFNA by March 15, 2005 (Fee payable to FFNA \$20)

Regular Processing, on-line, application & tax return must be received by FFNA by March 29, 2005 (Fee payable to FFNA \$30)

Fastback Processing, on-line or USPS, application & tax return must be received by FFNA by April 8, 2005 (Fee payable to FFNA \$40)

Applications and brochures will be available starting February 19th at the State of the School Family Meeting. Funds available for Tuition Assistance and 2005-2006 tuition rates will be announced at this time.

PARENT TEACHER FELLOWSHIP MINUTES

OCTOBER 8, 2004

Cindy Cox called the meeting to order and opened in prayer. The reading of the September minutes was waived. May minutes will be approved at the next meeting.

Treasurer's Report: Sandra presented the following reports: Cash Flow Statement, and PTF Budget numbers through October 8, 2004. Cash balance was \$18,313.50 with an estimated \$5,259.15 available after unpaid expenses have been paid. President Elect Report: Marne presented the wish list requests postponed from the last meeting, with an additional two new requests. Discussion started with the request for built in storage cabinets by Mrs. Letch for the office. It was determined that more information on the possible cost would be needed. Marne will speak with Mrs. Letch and ask her to set up a time with Dave Clark to get an estimate on the cost, as he will possibly volunteer to build them. There was a request for a digital camera for the yearbook. It was agreed that due to a lack of quality of pictures from the disposable cameras currently being used that PTF would purchase a new digital camera. PTF would like to encourage the use of extreme care in checking out this new camera to the students so as to lengthen the longevity of the camera. Tami moved to spend up to \$400 for a digital camera and a memory card. Sandra seconded. Motion passed. The need for a vertical file sorter cabinet requested by Mrs. Greene was discussed. This will help cut down on storage problems in the music room and with the space needed for the musicals. Tami moved that we approve up to \$375 plus shipping costs to cover the purchase of the cabinet. Darla seconded. Motion passed. Early Civilization Maps and Classical Tradition Maps for Mr. Martin were discussed. Sandra moved that we approve up to \$380.00 for the purchase of the set of 10 maps that come on tripods. Tami seconded. Motion passed.

Fund raiser Report: Tami reported the Innisbrook order will be here on Tuesday or Wednesday. Emails can be sent out to let parents know that the Innisbrook orders are in and we can make stickers for the younger students. A report will be given to Colleen Lippe for insertion in the newsletter about the top sellers, top class, how much was made, etc. Tami will check on available dates for a CiCi's pizza night. Christmas store shopping will be finished up-possibly with a shopping trip next week.

Old Business: Cindy notified Mr. Waldy that PTF had voted to approve up to \$400 towards shirts for the faculty for the 25th year celebration. Jane Unruh will take over the used uniform closet. She will clean and size uniforms, as well as maintain, the closet. Cindy and Tami volunteered to paint the closet.

New Business: Cindy mentioned the need for more treasure chest items. It was decided that PTF would replenish it. Darla will order new items. Further discussion was held on other possible uses for the remaining fund raising money. Replacement of some items on the playground was discussed. Kim will check on amounts for new playground surfaces. Cindy will check with Tammy Eilert to find out what is required for her license. PTF is enjoying our new room in the day care house. Ideas were discussed on how we can donate or "bless" Tammy for the use of it. Sandra motioned that we approve the purchase of gift cards from Walmart that can be used to purchase supplies for the day care, to be paid in installments for \$100 each semester for the 2004/2005 school year. Tami seconded. Motion passed. Darla reported there wasn't enough money in the classroom party fund to pay Mr. Haberkorn. She is short \$16. Darla motioned that PTF pay \$16 to Mr. Waldy to cover the difference for the 8th grade classroom parties. Tami seconded. Motion passed.

- 6) You must sign a WAIVER OF RESPONSIBILITY form before certificates will be mailed to you or released with your child. These forms will be kept on file, and CPLS accepts no responsibility for certificates delivered in this manner.
