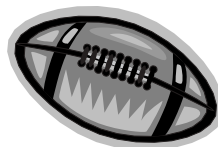

UNIFORM COMMITTEE RECOMMENDATIONS REGARDING ENFORCEMENT OF OUTERWEAR POLICY

One of the rules that has been around for many years at Cair Paravel-Latin School is that coats and non-uniform outerwear may not be worn in the classrooms. There are now several outerwear options such as uniform fleece, uniform sweaters and spirit wear sweat-shirts that are available to keep students warm in the classroom. We have had quite a bit of non-compliance with that rule, especially at the high school level and demerits have not been effective. After receiving feedback from you, the parents, on the proposed enforcement of confiscating the non-uniform outerwear for a week and requiring a fine of \$5.00 to pick them up, the uniform committee has recommended a lesser penalty. Upon the first offense, we will be keeping non-uniform outerwear down in the office for the day. They may be picked up at the end of the day. For the second offense, non-uniform outerwear may be picked up only upon payment of a \$5.00 fine. Fines collected will be put in the scholarship fund for financial aid to families who qualify for financial assistance. With the onset of colder weather, we would appreciate your cooperation with the new policy. Thanks,
