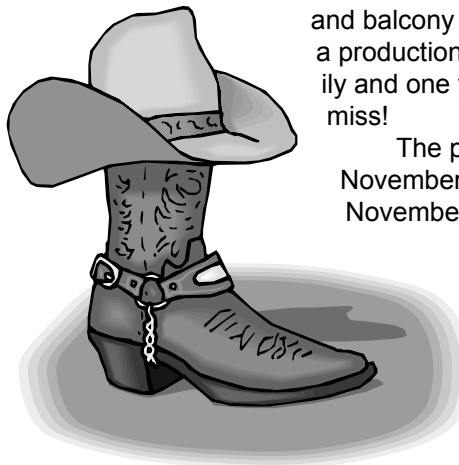

PARENT TEACHER FELLOWSHIP MINUTES FEBRUARY 12, 2004

In attendance: Tami Foster, Sandra Fienhage, Leanna Clark, Karol Luttjohann, Melissa French, Cindy Cox, Cathy Henley, Cindy Patton, Anne Sawyer, and Jaye Conner.

Tami called the meeting to order. Sandra opened in prayer.

The CP-LS Madrigals surprised the Committee with "In the Still of the Night" as a Valentine's Day present serenade. Thank you for this wonderful gift, Melody! It was appreciated.

A presentation was given by Amy Dymterko, an Innisbrook Fundraising representative, for consideration as CP-LS' fall 2004 fundraiser. After the presentation there was a Question and Answer session. Cindy Patton motioned to accept Innisbrook as the fall 2004 fundraiser with a 1-year contract. Leanna seconded. Discussion followed. The motion was passed. Karol motioned, and Jaye seconded, that we accept Innisbrook as the fall 2004 fundraiser and the 2005 fundraiser, giving Innisbrook a 2-year contract (replacing the original 1-year contract). Discussion followed with the point being made there was a higher profit incentive for a 2-year contract. Motion passed. Tami will contact Ms. Dymterko with PTF's acceptance.

Leanna gave the Treasurer's report. Due to a printer malfunction Leanna was unable to bring a hard copy of an updated report. She was able to report on the following: For Income: an additional \$0.50 was added to General Mills Box Tops; a deposit was made of \$120.00 for coaster sales to the general fundraisers line; For Expenses: the Christmas Store had additional receipts presented which totaled \$33.83 in disbursements; there was a faculty appreciation luncheon expense of \$225.88; under special line items books were purchased for the library which totaled \$330.96. Holding out start up money for the 2004/2005 school year there is \$3,935.05 available to spend for the rest of this fiscal year.

Cindy Cox gave the President Elect's report. Cindy was able to find Gorilla basketball goals at Dick's on sale for \$599.00. They are of superior quality. She reported that the last of the Garage Sale money would be used to purchase 1 Gorilla basketball goal. Leanna motioned and Karol seconded to purchase a second goal at \$599.00 with an additional \$100.00 being made available for any installation costs. Cindy also reported, due to the recent snows, it had not been possible to purchase and spread all of the previously approved mulch for the playground. This would be finished as soon as weather permits.

Jaye gave the Secretary's report. She mentioned a need in the theater for a mike to be replaced or fixed. Cindy Cox mentioned that Brad Cox was already looking into this situation. Jaye also reported that she had reviewed the checkbook and it had reconciled.

Sandra gave the Volunteer Coordinator's report. The extra coupon cards had been distributed. She requested names for the Volunteer Appreciation list be turned into her as soon as possible.

Cindy Patton gave the School Administrator's report. There will be a CP-LS Showcase and Open House Saturday, March 13, 2004 from 3:00 to 6:00 in the afternoon. There may be a need for volunteers.

Tami gave the Fundraising report. Sandra reported for Sara Cook that the Christmas Store had gone well and requested keeping the same participants, K through 5th grade, next year. There will be a CiCi's pizza night April 22. We still have extra trash bags available. Discussion was held on whether to sell trash bags again. No consensus was reached.

Karol motioned we purchase a T. V. for each of the 1st floor classrooms at a price of up to \$1,500.00 (with brackets and installation included), subject to Brad Cox's approval for placement in each classroom. Cindy Patton seconded and the motion passed.

There will be an Executive Committee meeting Thursday, 3/11/04 at 1:00 p.m. in the CP-LS library. The regular business meeting will follow at 1:30 p.m. meeting adjourned.

There being no further business, meeting was adjourned.

2005 MAACS COMPETITION

MEMO NO. I
OCTOBER 21, 2004

CPLS participates in the MAACS (Mid-America Association of Christian Schools) regional competition annually. The competition includes the areas of Bible, Music, Speech Visual Art, and Academics. Elementary competition includes grades 5 & 6; Jr. High competition includes grades 7 through 9; and Sr. High competition includes grades 10 through 12. All students are encouraged to participate and begin preparing early. A list of competition categories is available from Mrs. Aadalen and can also be found on the CPLS website @ www.cpls.org.

COMPETITION DATES:

Jr. and Sr. High: Grades 7 through 12 - March 17 & 18, 2005

Elementary: Grades 5 and 6 - April 8, 2005

THE PROCESS:

Any 5th through 12th grade student is eligible to participate in the MAACS Bible, Academic, and Fine Arts Competition. The competition itself limits our school to 2 entries per individual category and 1 entry per group category.

INTERESTED STUDENTS MUST:

1. Meet with either their classroom teacher (5th through 8th grades) or the appropriate teacher for their category to ensure that the piece they are working on meets the competition requirements.
2. Fill out the appropriate entry form and return to Mrs. Aadalen by Friday, December 17, 2004, along with a photocopy of the piece you have chosen (music, speech and Bible categories). These entry forms are available from Mrs. Aadalen - located in the clear holders on the wall in the cafeteria outside her office door. They can also be downloaded from the CPLS website.
3. Be prepared to present the speech, music, Bible, or artwork by the last week of January 2005. (For speech, music and Bible categories, in the event there would be a need for an "in-house" competition to determine which 2 students would represent CPLS at the MAACS competition) (for visual art - the CPLS visual art competition will be the first week of February to determine MAACS entries.) SEE ENTRY FORMS FOR DETAILS.
