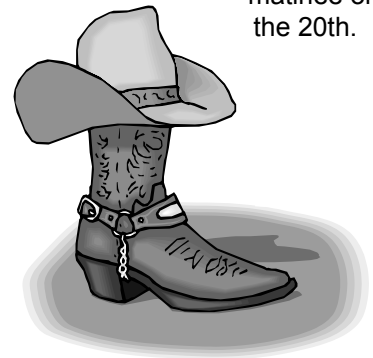

CPLS BOARD SEEKS VOLUNTEERS

At its meeting on September 21, 2004, the CPLS Board approved bylaw amendments establishing Board member qualifications, term limits, and a seven-member nominating committee to assist the Board with selection of its members, to replace those directors whose terms have expired. The amendments also describe different procedures for filling vacant seats and removing Board members. The Board is now preparing to select three directors whose terms end in May 2005 and will be following the selection procedure established in the newly amended bylaw. The Nominating Committee is to be composed of not more than three currently serving Board members and not less than three non-Board parents of students currently enrolled at CPLS. The Board is now seeking volunteers from the non-Board parent population of the CPLS family to fill four Nominating Committee positions.

Nominating Committee members will be responsible for the following:

Notifying the CPLS family of the open Board positions; Accepting nominee applications; Soliciting nominees; Reviewing nominee applications; Interviewing eligible Board candidates; Submitting names of eligible candidates to the Board; and Recommending eligible candidates to fill the open positions.

If you are interested in volunteering to serve as a member of the Nominating Committee, please submit your name in writing to the CPLS office by the close of school on November 12, 2004.

PARENT TEACHER FELLOWSHIP MINUTES

JUNE 10, 2004

In attendance: Karol Luttjohann, Cindy Cox, Cindy Patton, Deb Jorgenson, Anne Sawyer, Marne Fischer, Tami Foster, Melissa French, Sandra Fienhage and Jaye Conner.

Cindy Cox called the meeting to order and opened in prayer.

Treasurer's Report: Sandra reported that Leanna shows the checkbook balance as of 06-09-04 = \$5,857.20. Of that amount, \$745.55 is the facilities garage sale money being held in the PTF checking account. There is still one outstanding bill of approximately \$111.00 for a wish list item purchased in May. Therefore, PTF's tentative carryover amount is \$5,000.65. The 2004-05 proposed budget was reviewed line by line. Karol advised that the fundraiser income line should show our net income instead of the gross income. This would then change the total income amount from \$31,518.00 to \$17,518.00 and the total expense line from \$23,126.50 to \$9,126.50. Sandra also reported that when the June bank statement comes, someone not on the bank account (possibly Jaye) will reconcile the statement and the end of the year totals for accountability purposes. A report will be given to Cindy C., Marne and also at the next PTF meeting. A sample purchase order was shown and the committee was reminded that a purchase order must be filled out for any check written by the treasurer. The purchase order will be a one page carbon copy form and possibly a different color than the school's purchase orders so they can be easily identified.

Fundraising Coordinator's Report: Tami reported that if it is cost effective, we'd like to plan to offer trash bags as a service to CPLS families who would like to buy them. Tami will prepare a flyer that will go out in the July mailing. Orders and payment would be due by the end of July so the bags could be available for pick up at enrollment. Innisbrook fundraiser is tentatively scheduled to begin August 30, 2004. Convocation presentations would be done August 30 and 31st. Sales packets would possibly be sent home Thursday, August 26th. Suggested ending date is Monday, September 13. Innisbrook information will be available at PTF's table at enrollment. Karol volunteered to do some type of guessing jar for the PTF table.

New Business: Melissa has volunteered to coordinate back to school parties. Swimming parties versus other types of parties were discussed. It was noted that last year's parties had conflicted with some sports practices. Tentative dates for K-8th parties are August 19th or 20th. Possible locations for K-8th swim parties are Hillcrest, Wood Valley, Blaisdel and Lake Shore. It was noted that Blaisdel pool cannot be rented and renting the party room there is not cost effective. The party for upper school students was discussed with West Ridge Lanes Family Fun Center mentioned as a possibility. Tentative date: Saturday, August 21 from noon to 2:00 p.m. Jaye motioned to fund up to \$400.00 to pay for back to school parties. This amount includes the \$86.74 above expenses that PTF collected from last year's parties. The \$90.07 has already been given to the school. Cindy P. seconded motion. Motion passed. Melissa will check on dates and times and get a flyer ready for the July mailing.

Cindy Cox reported that PTF is in need of a volunteer coordinator for the upcoming year.

Old Business: Update was given on the laminator in the teacher's workroom. Although the current one works it is quite old and sometimes hard to deal with. The teachers would probably appreciate a newer one. Deb will check on the condition of the laminator and the size of paper it uses and how much paper is left. Sharpening of the die cuts was discussed. It was mentioned the pad needs to be changed more often rather than the dies needing sharpening. Since PTF approved up to \$2,000.00 to be used towards the laminator and any sharpening needs, no further vote is needed by the committee. Cindy Cox will be looking into the die cut situation.

One of the wall mounted TV's purchased by PTF has fallen off the wall in one of the classrooms. It is not known if the TV still works. There are plans for the mounting bracket and the wall it was on to be evaluated.

Announcements: The next executive committee meeting will be held Friday, September 10, 2004 at 2:30 p.m. -3:30 p.m. Then at 3:45 p.m. the general association meeting will be held to discuss and adopt the new budget.

2005 MAACS COMPETITION

MEMO NO. I
OCTOBER 21, 2004

CPLS participates in the MAACS (Mid-America Association of Christian Schools) regional competition annually. The competition includes the areas of Bible, Music, Speech Visual Art, and Academics. Elementary competition includes grades 5 & 6; Jr. High competition includes grades 7 through 9; and Sr. High competition includes grades 10 through 12. All students are encouraged to participate and begin preparing early. A list of competition categories is available from Mrs. Aadalen and can also be found on the CPLS website @ www.cpls.org.

COMPETITION DATES:

Jr. and Sr. High: Grades 7 through 12 - March 17 & 18, 2005

Elementary: Grades 5 and 6 - April 8, 2005

THE PROCESS:

Any 5th through 12th grade student is eligible to participate in the MAACS Bible, Academic, and Fine Arts Competition. The competition itself limits our school to 2 entries per individual category and 1 entry per group category.

INTERESTED STUDENTS MUST:

1. Meet with either their classroom teacher (5th through 8th grades) or the appropriate teacher for their category to ensure that the piece they are working on meets the competition requirements.
2. Fill out the appropriate entry form and return to Mrs. Aadalen by Friday, December 17, 2004, along with a photocopy of the piece you have chosen (music, speech and Bible categories). These entry forms are available from Mrs. Aadalen - located in the clear holders on the wall in the cafeteria outside her office door. They can also be downloaded from the CPLS website.
3. Be prepared to present the speech, music, Bible, or artwork by the last week of January 2005. (For speech, music and Bible categories, in the event there would be a need for an "in-house" competition to determine which 2 students would represent CPLS at the MAACS competition) (for visual art - the CPLS visual art competition will be the first week of February to determine MAACS entries.) SEE ENTRY FORMS FOR DETAILS.
