NO PARKING ZONE!

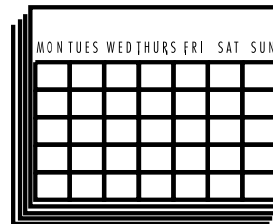

SEPTEMBER 11, 2003

In attendance were Tami Foster, Cindy Cox, Leanna Clark, Jaye Conner, Cindy Patton, Anne Sawyer, Cathy Henley, Cori Power, Melissa French, Sandra Fienhage and Laurie Packer.

Tami called the meeting to order and opened in prayer.

The July 18, 2003 minutes were read and approved by general consent.

Treasurer's Report: Leanna presented the final 2002-2003 budget figures.

* The total income was \$34,284.54. This total income plus the carryover from 2001-02 enabled PTF to have \$37,103.67 in total expenditures.

*Leanna presented the 2003-04 proposed budget. Projected income for this year is \$13,838.00. Projected expenditures are \$16,027.50. The amount in the PTF account carried over to the 2003-04 budget is \$9,680.91. The projected income plus the carryover amount will fund the expenditures. This year's budget will be presented for adoption at the general PTF meeting.

*Current expenditures: PTF collected \$86.74 above expenses for the 2003 back to school parties. This amount will be set aside and reinvested in the 2004 parties. Cindy P. stated that the school had already purchased items for the treasure chest used at the grammar school's convocation. PTF will reimburse the school.

President-Elect's report: Cindy Cox presented requests received by PTF.

*Anne motioned to purchase a fog machine for the music/drama department at a cost of \$118.48. Leanna seconded. Motion carried.

*Cathy motioned to purchase a telephone headset at a cost of \$300.00 for the office. Cori seconded. Motion carried. Sandra offered an amendment to the motion to approve up to \$400.00 for the telephone headset and lifter. Cathy seconded. Motion carried as amended.

Fundraising Coordinator's report: Laurie presented the total amount of trash bags and lawn/leaf bags sold were 1411.

*Anne motioned to buy 1450 rolls. Sandra seconded. Motion carried.

*Other fundraisers discussed were Box Tops for Education, Target credit cards and Innisbrook.

Volunteer Coordinator's report: Sandra presented results of back to school party surveys.

*Majority of responses supported these parties.

*Sandra suggested PTF no longer reserve the party room for rhetoric students at Blaisdell since expenses are difficult to recoup.

Announcements: PTF's general meeting for adoption of the 2003-04 budget will be Monday, September 29, 2003 at 3:30 p.m. in the cafeteria. PTF's next executive committee meeting will be held Thursday, October 9, 2003 at 1:30 p.m. in the library.

Meeting adjourned.
