PRACTICE FIELD RENOVATION COMPLETED

A major change has occurred on our campus with the installation of a new chain link fence around our practice field which is on the east side of Clay Street.

On behalf of the Board of Directors, Administration, Teachers and Students we would like to extend a special thank you to Marvin Spees for his willingness to lead us to completion of this project. We also appreciate the high quality and timely installation by the Henderson Fence Company.

This field will be used by our soccer and football teams for practice as well as physical education classes.

An 8 foot fence was installed on the east and west sides with 10 foot fence on the north and south ends. This height of fence should keep as many balls as possible inside the field of play. A 12 foot drive through gate was installed on the north west corner with walk through gates on the east and west sides.

What a blessing it will be to have a grassed area for outside activities of our school. Our school is truly blessed by parents who are willing to provide for the needs of our school.

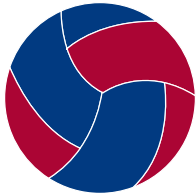

CPLS MAKES PRESENCE KNOWN AT KCAA STATE TOURNAMENT

Cair Paravel-Latin School Boys Soccer and Girls Volleyball teams participated in the annual Kansas Christian Athletic Association state tournament October 27-28 in Wichita, KS.

VOLLEYBALL: The Girls Volleyball team placed 2nd in the KCAA state tournament. They defeated Veritas Christian School 2-0 (25-16, 26-24) in the semi-final round. The Lady Lions fell to the Wichita Area Homeschoolers Athletic Association team 0-3 (22-25, 22-25, 23-25) in a closely fought final match. Named to the all-tournament team were: Brianne Clark (12th) and Hillary Caywood (12th). The Lady Lions, coached by Phil Parker, end their season with a 20-9 record.

SOCCER: The Boys Soccer team advanced to the KCAA Championship match by defeating Christ Preparatory Academy of Kansas City, KS 3 – 2 in double over-time in the semi-finals. Regulation play goals were scores by Greyson Honaker and Jaron Marcus; Gabe Letch had 1 assist. Ryan Baker scored the winning goal in over-time assisted by Gabe Letch.

The boys went on to win the Championship match, defeating Olathe Christian School 3-2 in overtime. Greyson Honaker scored both goals during regulation play, with an assist by Ryan Baker. Senior Gabe Letch scored the winning goal in overtime with only 1:06 elapsed. This is the 6th KCAA state championship for the Cair Paravel soccer team in the last 7 years. Named to the all tournament team were: Ryan Baker (9th), Greyson Honaker (12th), Andrew Lippe (11th) and Taylor Petrik (10th). The team is led by Coach Mark Congdon and assistant coach James Seidel. The Lions completed their season with a record of 11-3.

2007 M.A.A.C.S COMPETITION

CPLS participates in the MAACS regional competition annually. The competition includes the areas of Bible, Music, Speech, Visual Art and Academics. Elementary competition includes grades 5 and 6; Junior High, grades 7 through 9; and Senior High, grades 10 through 12. All students are encouraged to participate in this enriching experience. A complete list of competition categories is available from Mrs. Williams and can also be found on the CPLS website. Guidelines regarding categories can be found at the Cornerstone Family School website at www.cfs-online.org.

Competition Dates for 2007:

Jr. and Sr. High – Grades 7 through 12 – March 15 & 16

Elementary – Grades 5 & 6 – March 23

How do I participate?

The competition limits our school to 2 entries per individual category and 1 entry per group category, except for academic testing. Therefore, while any student may sign up for individual events, some categories may require the use of auditions, testing or judging to determine who participates in the competition.

Interested students must:

1. Meet with either their classroom teacher (5th – 8th grades) or the appropriate teacher for the category to insure that the piece they are working on meets the competition requirements.
2. Fill out the appropriate entry form and return it to Mrs. Williams by January 5th. Entry forms will be located in the holders on the wall in the cafeteria or available from Mrs. Williams.
3. Be prepared to present the speech, music, Bible or artwork by January 31st, 2007.
