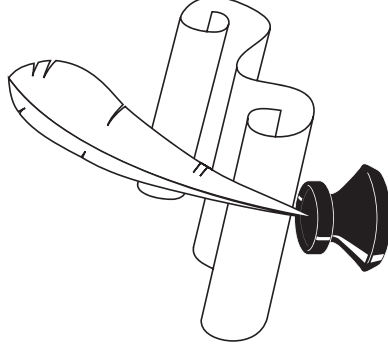

The High School Essay Prep seminar is an excellent way to get immediate experience and inside tips on how to do your best on the timed, 25 minute response to a prompt required on the new SAT test. Participants will actually write two full essays, carefully study and then apply the College Board evaluation criteria to sample essays, while receiving a detailed booklet of resources and lesson plans for continued practice.

Additionally, students will learn special structure and style tools for use in composing the college application “personal essay” - an entirely different type of writing task. The complete process will be presented: choosing the question, creating the outline, and polishing a final version. Participants will leave with a clear concept of the task, their own outline for an actual personal essay, and several new tricks and techniques to add to their repertoire.

Although this seminar is specifically designed for those who will be taking the SAT or submitting college applications within the next 1-2 years (and especially those teaching such students), it is also useful for general writing practice, tools and tips. It is open to all students, regardless of their experience with IEW courses or materials. A lot of actual writing is done during this six-hour class.

Here are some comments from past attendees in Alaska and California:

“I really didn’t want to come, but my mom made me, and I am soooo glad I did. It’s really going to help me, and I’m not so worried about the SAT essay any more.”

“I took the SAT last spring and did okay, but I’m going to do it again and go for a better score. With this new information, I’m very sure I’ll do better on the essay portion.”

“Mr. Pudewa’s seminar is like the rock concert of writing classes.”

“This workshop just de-mystified the whole thing for me. Thanks!”

“Although I’ve been in many of your classes before, this was awesome. I especially loved the strategies for quickly planning and outlining a short essay, and the advice about how to formulate an opinion and just go for it, even if you’re a little undecided about the question. Also the TRIAC paragraph model is awesome—it makes it so easy to organize a good paragraph.”

Andrew Pudewa is the director of the Institute for Excellence in Writing and a homeschooling father of seven. His seminars for parents, students and teachers have helped transform many a reluctant writer and have equipped educators with powerful tools to dramatically improve students’ skills.

Although he is a graduate of the Talent Education Institute in Japan and holds a Certificate of Child Brain Development from the Institute for the Achievement of Human Potential in Philadelphia, Pennsylvania, his best endorsement is from a young Alaskan boy who called him “the funny man with the wonderful words.” He and his wife Robin currently teach their four youngest children at home in Atascadero, California.

CPLS participates in the MAACS regional competition annually. The competition includes the areas of Bible, Music, Speech, Visual Art and Academics. Elementary competition includes grades 5 and 6; Junior High, grades 7 through 9; and Senior High, grades 10 through 12. All students are encouraged to participate in this enriching experience. Competition Dates for 2007:

Jr. and Sr. High – Grades 7 through 12 – March 15 & 16

How do I participate?

The competition limits our school to 2 entries per individual category and 1 entry per group category, except for academic testing. Therefore, while any student may sign up for individual events, some categories may require the use of auditions, testing or judging to determine who participates in the competition.

Interested students must:

1. Meet with either their classroom teacher (5th – 8th grades) or the appropriate teacher for the category to insure that the piece they are working on meets the competition requirements.
2. Fill out the appropriate entry form and return it to Mrs. Williams by January 5th. Entry forms will be located in the holders on the wall in the cafeteria or available from Mrs. Williams.
3. Be prepared to present the speech, music, Bible or artwork by January 31st, 2007.

Tammy called the meeting to order and opened the meeting in prayer. She passed around thank-yous from teachers for their start-up money and wish list items.

The minutes from the June meeting read and approved as amended.

Treasurer's Report – Jaye Conner: Jaye passed out a report compiled from Sandra Fienhage with an ending balance of \$10,449.37 for the 2005-06 school year. This money will also be the amount to start the 2006-07 school year. Actual cash on hand is \$8,703.04 and total funds available are \$2,452.03. Jaye also prepared the budget for the 2006-07 school year. Items were discussed for the upcoming year. The budget will be presented at the Open Meeting at 3:30 pm today. See attached reports.

President-Elect – Edye Freund: Edye reported she is receiving Wish List requests from the teachers and some items have already been purchased. See attached report. Edye presented a request from T. Leach – request for seven books for his classroom (total is under \$100) – concerns that this should fall under the school's curriculum budget and also the need for Mr. Waldy's approval. She will follow up on this with Mr. McFarland and Mr. Waldy. There was discussion about future requests from teachers in regard to text materials for the classroom

Board of Directors Liaison – Shari Albrecht: Shari expressed from the Board their apology for the conflict with the Back to School party and the Board Meeting.

Family Activities Coordinator – Lynn DeGross: Tammy reported for Lynn to submit any suggestions for next years Back to School party. There was also discussion about sponsoring CiCi Pizza nights again this year.

Volunteer Coordinator – Melissa French: Melissa inquired about the money to give to Room Mom's. She has met with them and compiled folders for them. It was also discussed to schedule a vision screening this year. Sara Cook volunteered to contact doctors and organize it.

Fundraising Coordinator – Cindy Cox: Innisbrook packets are due Monday, Sept. 18. There was discussion about possibly having Innisbrook handle the accounting of orders and money. This is a new service they are offering. Cindy is going to try and meet with Colleen Lippe and Amy from Innisbrook to discuss details.

Melody Congdon – lockers – New lockers are needed for 8th-12th graders. In the past PTF has purchased lockers annually to replace the broken ones. Mr. McFarland is going to check on some that might be available. Discussion was tabled until next meeting.

J. Seidel - \$140 for gifts for Intramural Scholars Bowl students and \$125+s/h for a physics apparatus – It was approved to spend an additional \$50 to purchase the physics apparatus. It was decided to table the Scholars Bowl gifts.

Water fountain corrosion – Tammy will check into to see if Facilities can replace this.

Playground rules sign – Tammy will look into the cost of posting a sign on the playground for all monitors/volunteers to follow.

Tammy announced the General Meeting would be at 3:30 in the library. The next PTF Executive Committee meeting will be October 13 at 1:30pm in the Daycare House.

The meeting adjourned at 3:25pm.
