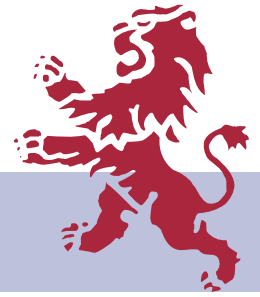

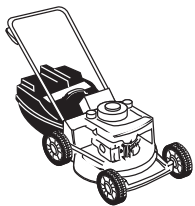

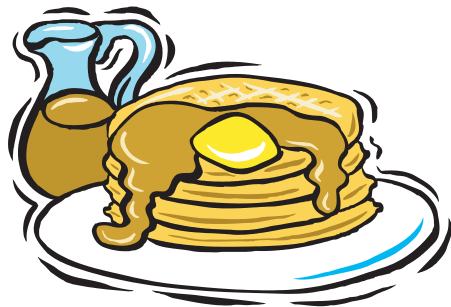
VOLUNTEER MOWERS NEEDED

TUITION ASSISTANCE – LAST CALL

If you are planning on applying for Tuition Assistance for the 2007-08 school year, but have not yet done so, please note that the time is NOW!

Family Financial Needs Assessment (FFNA), an objective third party, processes the applications and assesses each family's financial situation for CPLS. In order to be able to communicate awards to families by Monday, April 23, the "Regular Processing" deadlines have passed, but you still have a few more days to apply using the final option:

Fastback Processing, on-line (at www.ffna1.com) or USPS, application & tax return must be received by FFNA by March 30, 2007 (Fee payable to FFNA \$40)
