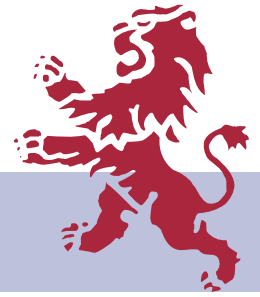

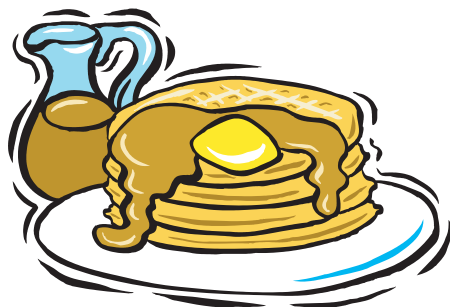

Tammy called the meeting to order and opened us in prayer.

Sara read the minutes from the January meeting. They were approved as amended.

PTF Audit Committee – Colleen Lippe

Colleen Lippe and Alan Conroy were asked to serve as the Audit Committee and perform a review of the 2005-2006 financial records as authorized in Article VI, Sec. 2(e) of the PTF Bylaws. Colleen presented the report of the 2005-2006 financial records for the PTF. (See report.) All financial statements were found accurate in all material respects. Their observations and recommendations were reviewed.

Treasurer's Report - Jaye Conner

Jaye presented financial reports (see attached) year to date. She noted on the Profit/Loss Budget vs. Actual Report, there is a deposit of \$337.70 from Box Tops, which is \$87.70 over budget. Christmas Store money will be updated and corrected on next report. The checkbook is reconciled through November 2006. On the year-to-date report, she corrected the available funds from \$738.29 to \$2,738.29. Report filed.

LAMPLIGHTER BOOKS FOCUS ON BIBLICAL TRUTHS

There are many Biblical truths to be found in the Lamplighter book series. These books ministered to me in a way no other fictional works have. It is interesting to see how God shapes and molds the characters in these books. Here are some thoughts from different books that had an impact on me.

In *Teddy's Button*, a little boy named Teddy is intent on being a soldier some day. When he understands what it means to be a soldier in God's army, he enlists right away. Teddy sees God as his captain and he is determined to hold His banner of love high. He learns that the biggest battle he faces as God's soldier is the spiritual battle going on inside himself. Teddy describes this struggle in such a way that a person of any age could understand.

In the *House of Love*, Doris, the despairing, mistreated orphan imagines she is living in "God's House of Love" because God is love and she is God's child so she must be dwelling in "God's House of Love". She sees every little gift and kindness that happens to come her way as God preparing a table for her in the presence of her enemies. She believes that "one can be absolutely sure of having a place in the thoughts of God".

Another orphan named Milly in the book *Probable Sons* imagines most everyone she meets is a potential prodigal son and earnestly prays for them to return to their fathers. By her behavior, Milly unknowingly assists in bringing her guardian, Uncle Edward, who truly is a prodigal son, back to God. Uncle Edward observes Milly's relationship with the Lord and says to himself "I believe that child lives in the presence of God from morning to night".

The spiritual messages in the Lamplighter books are great teaching tools and they will bless you and your children.
