NATIONAL LATIN EXAM HONORS ANNOUNCED

On Wednesday, March 14 sixty-eight students gathered in the Stone Table Theater to compete in the National Latin Exam. I am very pleased to announce that out of those participants, thirty-three were awarded certificates and/or medals for scoring above the national average. As a school over the past four years, this is our best performance. Nearly ninety percent of our students scored fifty percent or above on the test. I am most proud of all the students who participated. The exam was given this year to over 134,000 students from all fifty states and 13 foreign countries.
