NOTICE OF BYLAWS AMENDMENT

Pursuant to Article VIII, Sec. 1 of the Bylaws of Cair Paravel Latin School, you are hereby notified of the action of the CPLS Board of Directors taken on April 24, 2007, by a two-thirds majority vote resulting in the following amendments to Article III of the CPLS Bylaws:

Section 2. Number and Qualification of Directors.

(a) The authorized number of directors of the corporation shall be no fewer than seven (7) and no more than nine (9). The Board's membership shall be composed so that directors represent at least four (4) different churches.

(b) Directors shall profess a personal relationship with Christ, live godly lifestyles, affirm the Statement of Faith set forth in the Constitution, feel called by God to serve as directors, be deeply conscious of their responsibility before God, and be committed to the principles of classical Christian education.

Directors shall be individuals whose lives make them worthy of imitation and hence appropriate role models for students. Directors shall demonstrate that they possess the spiritual gifts, the heart, the abilities, the character, and the life experiences that make them suitable for service as a member of the Board of Directors.

All school children of directors shall attend the School. Exceptions to this policy may be allowed by a majority vote of all directors.

Directors shall adhere to these qualifications throughout their tenure on the Board.

(c) Full-time employees of the School shall not serve as directors. Part-time employees and spouses of full-time employees may serve as directors but shall abstain from voting on all issues that may raise an appearance of impropriety or conflict of interest. (Amended: September 21, 2004; April 24, 2007.)

Section 3. Election and Term of Office.

(a) Each director shall serve on the Board for a term of three (3) years unless such service is terminated by resignation, death, or removal. Upon Board approval, a director may take a leave of absence of up to one year without forfeiting his seat or altering his term. A director may be renominated to serve a second consecutive term. After serving a second consecutive full three-year term on the Board, the director shall step down from service for at least one full year before again being eligible for election to the Board. Terms of service on the Board shall be staggered so that no more than three directors will complete their term of service in any given year.

(b) Nomination and renomination of Board candidates shall be made by a seven-member Nominating Committee composed of not more than three (3) currently serving Board directors and not less than three (3) non-Board parents of students currently enrolled in the school. By November 30, the Nominating Committee shall notify faculty, staff, and families of enrolled students that Board positions are open and that the committee will solicit and accept nominee applications until January 15. The Nominating Committee shall make every effort to solicit qualified applicants who have different church affiliations, ages of children, personalities, and skills.

(c) At the close of the nomination period, the Nominating Committee shall review the nominee applications and interview eligible Board candidates to determine interest, qualifications, and suitability for Board membership. By March 1, the Nominating Committee shall submit to the Board the names of all qualified applicants including a recommendation of the nominee(s) for the open position(s). All candidates shall meet the qualifications for Board members established in these Bylaws. Following the formal report of the Nominating Committee at the May annual meeting, the Board by a majority vote shall elect directors, if any at all, from the names the Nominating Committee submits. Nominations from the floor shall not be permitted. (Amended: September 21, 2004; October 26, 2004; April 24, 2007.)

Sandra made a motion to purchase 35 art boards with \$100 to come from her wish list money and the remaining balance not to exceed \$250 from other approved expenses. MK seconded. Discussion. Upper School Representative – Maureen Koopman

She reported that Mr. Seidel is not having the Scholars Bowl this year; therefore, he does not need any funds for prizes.

Fundraising Coordinator – Cindy Cox

Cindy reported that the cookie dough will be in on Wed., March 21 between 1-2pm. A check for \$3,192 has been written and paid to the company. 528 tubs were ordered. There will be approximately 60 tubs extra to sell.

She ordered a science fair book from Campbell's Soup labels to end our account there and asked to be removed from their list.

New Business

Tammy A. presented a request from Christine Myers for a paper shredder for the office. Jaye made a motion to buy a cross cut shredder up to \$100. SA seconded. Discussion. Motion passed. Tammy will purchase.

Tammy A. mentioned that we have traditionally replaced the elementary teacher's color paper supply each spring. Sara made a motion to replace each elementary teacher's colored paper supply (K-6), not to exceed \$200. EF seconded. Motion passed. Tammy A. will purchase.

Tammy A. also noted that we owe Tammy Eilert our second payment of \$100 for room rental. Jaye will write a check for purchase of a Walmart gift card.

The date is Saturday, April 21 from 7:30am – Noon. PTF was asked to host the event to kick off the Scholarship Endowment. She will talk with teachers about their involvement and basket theme.
