CPLS PTF MINUTES

JULY 25, 2007

Members present: Wendy Adams, Tammy Anderson, Cindy Cox, Sandra Fienhage, Edye Freund, Darla Hass, Kathleen Mallory, Cori Power, and Suzanne Robb.

With a quorum present, Edye called the executive committee meeting to order and opened in prayer. Sandra read the minutes from the April 13, 2007 meeting and the May 11, 2007 meeting. They were approved as read.

Treasurer's report-Jaye Conner Sandra reported in Jaye's absence. The Budget vs. Actual for July 2006 through June 2007 was presented. PTF's fiscal year ended June 30, 2007. The report shows that PTF was \$1,937.75 under budget. Total cash on hand as of June 30, 2007: \$22,394.70. Total restricted funds: \$16,997.34. Available funds when report was printed: \$5,397.36. It was then noted that Christmas store 2007 still has approximately \$1000.00 left to carry into budget year 2007/2008. Therefore the Available Funds would be reduced by that amount.

Jaye's proposals for the 2007/2008 PTF budget were discussed and members were asked to note the changes on their copies. Recommendations included removing the line for classroom parties as this money is no longer available from CPLS to distribute. Cori informed the committee that PTF may have these funds to distribute. A final decision will not be made by the CPLS Board until the end of August. Darla requested that teachers be informed as soon as possible about the Board's decision.

Total expenses for the April 2007 Pancake Feed were \$87.91. \$7,908.76 was raised for the Scholarship Endowment Fund. Jaye requested approval for writing a check. Sandra moved that PTF distribute the money raised to the Scholarship Endowment Fund. CC seconded. Motion carried.

It was pointed out that the money budgeted for Teacher/staff start up gift should probably be increased if PTF offers a bonus for attending the Back to school party. Cindy moved that PTF offer a \$25 cash bonus to Kindergarten through 8th grade teachers that attend the Back to School Party. CP seconded. Motion carried.

Cindy expressed concern about reducing the money budgeted for Treasure Chest prizes as she is aware that the chest did need to be filled another time last year but was not. Members were asked to look over the budget before PTF's next meeting and contact Jaye as soon as possible regarding any questions, concerns or suggestions.

President-Elect: Suzanne Robb was introduced as PTF's President Elect.

School Administrator: Kathleen Mallory was introduced as the representative for CPLS School Administration.

CPLS Board Representative-Cori Power The upper school Science and Spanish teachers have been hired.

Fundraising Coordinator-Cindy Cox Information given regarding the main PTF fundraiser which is Innisbrook. Packets will be sent home with students the first week of school. Younger students will have a presentation on Innisbrook during their convocation on the second Monday that school is in session. Cindy will set up times with Mrs. Congdon and also ask her to inform upper school of the event. Students will have 2 weeks to sell. Sale ends around September 13th. Cindy is working with our Innisbrook representative, Amy, on prize incentives that are appropriate for CPLS. They have given us a \$300 budget. Cindy will get a promotional ready for PTF's table at enrollment.

Cindy also spoke on the possibility of a Wendy's night fundraiser. PTF could set up a CPLS night and during set hours, Wendy's would give 10% of their sales from dine in or drive thru, to the school.

New Business

The Back to School Party will take place Tuesday, August 14, 2007, 6:00 p.m. at Reynold's Lodge at Lake Shawnee. Wendy Adams is coordinating this event. PTF will supply pasta, sauce, hamburger, paper goods and drinks. Families will be asked to bring bread, salad and dessert. A \$5 donation per family will be requested. There was discussion regarding door prizes, games for students, and how to welcome new families. Wendy will make a list of what she needs help with and send it to Sandra, who will forward it to the PTF committee. Sandra motioned to ratify \$600 for the party's expenses. DH seconded. Motion carried.

Mr. Waldy stopped in to verify if each faculty member will be receiving the traditional start up gift. PTF confirmed that each teacher will receive a \$25 start up gift regardless of whether they are full time or part time. He was also told about the \$25 bonus that will be offered to Kindergarten through 8th grade faculty who attend the Back to School party, again, regardless of their hours.

Edye requested volunteers to take turns sitting at the PTF table at enrollment on August 13th. Those who are available should email Edye as soon as possible.

Edye requested suggestions on who might be available to fill the open positions on the executive committee. These positions are Family Activities Coordinator, Volunteer Coordinator, Middle School Representative and possibly Upper School Representative. It was suggested that we contact middle and upper school teachers to make them aware of the openings in case any of them would be interested in serving on PTF.

Another open position is Teacher Appreciation Coordinator. Therefore, PTF will need to find someone to make arrangements for the August luncheon. A possible caterer was suggested. Sandra will contact Mr. Waldy regarding the date he would like the luncheon provided and then contact the caterer to check on their availability.

An 18" paper cutter has been requested for the teacher's workroom. More information was needed so that a well made, heavy duty cutter could be purchased. This item was deferred to PTF's next meeting.

Mrs. Eilert submitted a request to be reimbursed for an item she purchased during the process of setting up her new classroom. It was noted there are four teachers who will be setting up their own classrooms for the first time this year: Mrs. Eilert, Mrs. Mangiaracino, Mr. Barron, and Miss Setchell. Cori moved to reimburse each of these teachers \$75 for expenses related to setting up their classrooms. SR seconded. Discussion: They would receive reimbursement by turning in receipts. It was suggested that they be contacted soon about the availability of these funds. Motion passed.

The playground rules sign approved during the 2006-07 year was discussed. Its purpose was to bring consistency to the enforcement of rules on the playground. It's possible that this same goal can be accomplished with better communication. Tammy will forward the proposed sign to Mrs. Mallory and she will share a paper copy with faculty and the recess monitors. Then PTF will re-evaluate the need for an official sign.

Meeting adjourned at 2:50 p.m. The next PTF executive committee meeting will be Friday, September 14, 2007 at 1:30 p.m. in the daycare house. The association meeting will follow at 3:30 p.m. in the CPLS library for the purpose of adopting the budget.

- 5) Certificates are the same as cash, and should be handled accordingly. CPLS will not be responsible for certificates that are lost, stolen or misplaced while in your possession.
- 6) You must sign a WAIVER OF RESPONSIBILITY form before certificates will be mailed to you or released with your child. These forms will be kept on file, and CPLS accepts no responsibility for certificates delivered in this manner.
