**FROM THE DEAN’S DESK...**

Our development coordinator, Mark Bucholtz, and I had the privilege of attending the South Central Association of Christian Schools International Administrators Conference on Monday and Tuesday of this past week. It was the best conference of its kind that I have attended in several years. Mark and I found ourselves encouraged and energized by the sessions (and meeting Jay Novacek of the Dallas Cowboys was a fun bonus).

These are challenging times for the Christian school movement, and much of the focus of the conference was upon examining the effectiveness and efficiency of our ministries. Dr. Alan Pue, President of the Barnabas Group of Littleton, Colorado was the keynote speaker. In his main presentation, entitled, “In Search of Excellence: Become a School Worth Supporting,” his primary argument was that a quality school’s mission should address four key areas: Content, Character, Community and Communion. As he spoke, I considered the mission of CPLS and found myself pleased and encouraged that our school does just those things – and even in that order, which was purely coincidental.

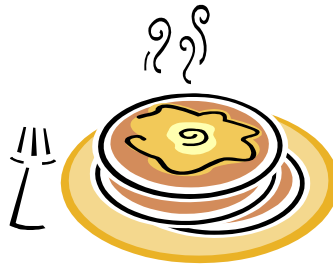

## CLASSICS CORNER

We turn our attention this week from ancient Rome and the Latin language back to ancient Greece, the cradle of western culture. As we have written before, the great epic poems of Homer, the ancient Greek bard, known as the *Iliad* and the *Odyssey* have entertained and caused its listeners and readers pause for centuries.

The *Iliad* gave me pause this past Saturday during the Aquila Theater Company's performance at Topeka Public Library as part of the national Page and Stage program. This ancient poem, composed during the seventh (maybe sixth) centuries BC, was the cause of great commotion and confusion at our library on Saturday. The library staff had reserved a space for approximately 150 library patrons to view the performance of the *Iliad*. Ten minutes before the show was to begin, a line stretched from the doors of Marvin Auditorium into the great rotunda near the entrance. People of all ages, ethnicities, and backgrounds were eagerly awaiting the performance.

It was clear that the 150 seats would not be enough. The library staff, along with the help of CPLS volunteers, opened another section of the auditorium and brought in additional chairs. When the performance finally got underway, there were 254 people packed into the room watching the actors bring this ancient epic to life.

As I looked out at all those in attendance, I was reminded again that the *Iliad* is a classic in the truest sense of the word. It has stood the test of time – so much so that over 2,500 years after its composition, citizens of Topeka, KS gathered in a small auditorium to experience Homer's epic afresh. It was a beautiful moment.

### Did you know...

Among those in attendance on Saturday were over sixty members of the CPLS community. Parents and students ranging from Kindergarten to Grade 12 packed into the auditorium for the performance. Fourteen members of our JCL chapter handed out programs and evaluations for the library. It was a proud moment for our school.

### Lingua Antiqua

honor – this is the Latin word for, well, honor. Some Latin words come across directly into English with little or no change. *Honor* is one of those words.

κλέος (klēos – stress on the first syllable) – this is the Greek word for honor or glory. It can be used as something won for oneself, or it can be used to describe a song or poem recounting one's glory. So, it encompasses both the medium and the message.

## TUITION ASSISTANCE FOR 2009-10 SCHOOL YEAR

Tuition Assistance (Financial Aid) is available to new and returning families for the 2009-10 school year based upon financial need; most families qualify with either: 1) "adjusted gross income" under \$42,000, or 2) tuition greater than 10% of "adjusted gross income".

Family Financial Needs Assessment (FFNA), an objective third party, processes applications and assesses each family's financial situation for CPLS. Based upon FFNA's recommendations, Tuition Assistance funds available are divided among those families who qualify in time to be considered. In order to apply for tuition assistance for the 2009-10 school year, families simply need to apply to FFNA (and send a copy of their most recent Federal Income Tax Return) by the application deadline.

*Based on the processing times for each type of application and our goal to communicate awards to families by Monday, April 21, two application options are still available with the following deadlines:*

Regular Processing, on-line (at [www.ffna1.com](http://www.ffna1.com), fee payable to FFNA \$30), application & tax return must be received by FFNA by March 13, 2009.

Fastback Processing, on-line or USPS, (fee payable to FFNA \$40), application & tax return must be received by FFNA by March 27, 2009.

We have been reminded in our discussions that it is important to remember that the answer to “What is Cair Paravel?” should not be, “It’s a Christian school named after...”, but rather...

### **What is Cair Paravel Latin School?**

Ours is a K-12, classical Christian, liberal arts school. We are college preparatory in nature and view our mission as the cultivation of classically trained, life-long learners, committed to the Lordship of Jesus Christ, who will enrich their community and God’s kingdom.

### **What is the name Cair Paravel all about?**

Our founders chose the name from a series of children’s books by C.S. Lewis called *The Chronicles of Narnia*. Cair Paravel was the castle from which the children who entered Narnia ruled as Kings and Queens. It is for us a metaphor to remind us that just as the children who entered Narnia became more noble minded, character filled and committed to the Lord of the land, so should the children who attend our school be similarly transformed. When the children returned to their own world, they would be equipped to live as the Kings and Queens of Narnia that they had become. We desire the same for our children as members of God’s kingdom who engage the culture around them.

### **Why do you have “Latin” in your school name?**

As a classical school, our curriculum was crafted upon the model of the Latin grammar schools that were the educational staple of western civilization for hundreds of years. We also teach the Latin language for ordering correct thought, fostering precision in vocabulary and as a foundation for learning other modern languages.

### **What is your school’s vision?**

Cair Paravel aspires to become the premier classical Christian, liberal arts school in America.

### **What is your school’s mission?**

Our mission is to cultivate classically trained, life long learners, committed to the Lordship of Jesus Christ, who will enrich their community and God’s kingdom.

### **What do you mean by “classical”?**

In short, classical pertains to our materials and methods. We attempt to use materials that have stood the test of time. Most materials come from the great works and ideas of classical Greco-Roman culture, and historical Judeo-Christian, western civilization. Our methods conform to a long used model called the trivium or “three ways”.

### **What is the trivium?**

The three ways to best learn anything follow a path from grammar to logic to rhetoric.

These are also the three ways in which to address learning as a child grows, as they tend to target the learner’s propensities at different stages of development.

- In the grammar stage, students are taught the rules, facts and definitions of things primarily by rote and recitation and at a time in their lives when they most enjoy doing this.
- In the logic – or dialectic – stage, students are taught to think logically about different approaches and applications to the things they have learned. This is done at a time when they are most prone to argument and disputation.
- In the rhetoric stage, students are taught to be critical thinkers who can eloquently express themselves in their knowledge and beliefs, arts and abilities, and manner in which they live out their faith and practice.

### **What makes you a Christian school?**

We believe that all learning should be directed toward truth, and that all truth is God’s truth. As such, the Bible is taught directly and is also integrated into the teaching of all things. We are persuaded that the good life is one which seeks to glorify and enjoy Christ in all things, and that our students should be directed toward that end.

### **What is a liberal arts school?**

Quite literally, the liberal arts prepare a student to live as a “free” person. “Liber” is Latin for “free” and liberal implies a broad spectrum of knowledge that allows for such freedom. We seek to cultivate generalists who can converse intelligently and accurately on many subjects with a great degree of cultural literacy rather than specialists who know a lot about only a few things or a bunch of pop trivia that will not stand the test of time. Specialization will come in college as students begin to pursue their vocation in life, but no matter the choice of life’s work, our freedom and prosperity has always rested upon personal responsibility and a common body of knowledge, grounded in truth, which all citizens have been able to converse about intelligently and to which they have adhered to in order to maintain their freedoms.
