**TUITION ASSISTANCE - ONLY TWO MORE WEEKS**

If you have been planning on applying for Tuition Assistance for the upcoming school year, but have not yet done so, please note that time is running out. Tuition Assistance (Financial Aid) is available to new and returning families for the 2009-10 school year based upon financial need; most families qualify with either: 1) "adjusted gross income" under \$42,000, or 2) tuition greater than 10% of "adjusted gross income".

Family Financial Needs Assessment (FFNA), an objective third party, processes applications and assesses each family's financial situation for CPLS. Based upon FFNA's recommendations, Tuition Assistance funds available are divided among those families who qualify in time to be considered. In order to apply for tuition assistance for the 2009-10 school year, families simply need to apply to FFNA (and send a copy of their most recent Federal Income Tax Return) by the application deadline.

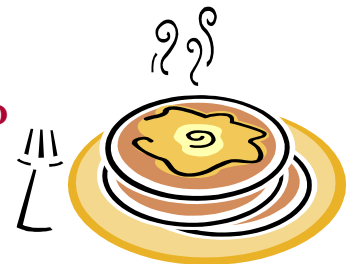
In order for us to be able to grant Tuition Assistance awards in April, the "Regular Processing" deadlines have passed, but you still have about two weeks to apply using the last option: Fastback Processing, on-line or USPS, (fee payable to FFNA \$40), application & tax return must be received by FFNA by March 27, 2009.

## CLASSICS CORNER

Last week, Mr. Martin introduced us to some of the wisdom of Ancient Rome. This week we turn to the founders of philosophy, the Ancient Greeks, for some more words of wisdom:

ἢ λέγε τι σιγῆς κρείττον ἢ σιγὴν ἔχε. (Μένανδρος)  
(*ē lege ti sigēs kreitton ē sigēn eche.*)

“Either say something better than silence, or keep silent.” (Menander)

ὁ θεὸς ἀγάπη ἐστὶ, καὶ ὁ μένων ἐν τῇ ἀγάπῃ ἐν τῷ θεῷ μένει, καὶ ὁ θεὸς ἐν αὐτῷ. (ἐκ τῆς πρώτης ἐπιστολῆς Ἰωάννου, Δ', ιζ')

(*ho theos agapē estī, kai ho menōn en tē agapē en tō theō menei, kai ho theos en autō.*)

“God is love, and the one remaining in love remains in God, and God in him.”  
(I John 4:17)

ὁ φίλος ἐστὶν ἄλλος αὐτός. (Ἀριστοτέλης)  
(*ho philos estin allos autos.*)

“The friend is another self.” (Aristotle)

πλούσιον δὲ νομίζοιμι τὸν σοφόν. (Σωκράτης ἐν τῷ Πλάτωνος Φαίδω)

(*plousion de nomizoimi ton sophon.*)

“Rich may I consider the wise man to be.” (Socrates in Plato’s dialogue, Phaedo)

κοινὰ τὰ τῶν φίλων. (Παροιμία Ἑλληνικῆ)

(*koina ta tōn philōn.*)

“Common are the things of friends.” or “Friends share all possessions.” (Greek Proverb)

### Did you know...

Did you notice the first word in the last quote, “koine”? This is the Greek word that means “common” and is also the word used to refer to the style of Greek that composes the original New Testament (i.e., *Koine Greek*). “Koine” describes the common, everyday form of the language, used by everyday people. It was not considered a polished literary form of the language and in fact some writers of the 1st century purposefully imitated the older style of Greek (which is like some today writing in King James English). Koine was a simplified form of classical Greek that was known to most of the Roman & Greek world at the time. It was quite fitting therefore, for the New Testament writers to use the Koine Greek rather than the Classical Greek so that the average, everyday person could hear and understand their message and not just philosophers and theologians.

### Lingua Antiqua (Ancient Language)

**sapientia** (*sah-pee-én-tee-ab*) – This word means something like wisdom or understanding. It can also mean philosophy. It originally comes from a verb meaning to taste. An English derivative is sapient, having wisdom or discernment.

φιλοσοφία (*phi-lo-soph-ia*) – This is the Greek word for “a lover of wisdom,” hence *philosopher*. It is composed of the Greek words “philos” (love) and “sophia” (wisdom).

- 6) You must sign a WAIVER OF RESPONSIBILITY form before certificates will be mailed to you or released with your child. These forms will be kept on file, and CPLS accepts no responsibility for certificates delivered in this manner.
