NEW RENWEB LOG IN

Renweb, our grade and attendance student information communication software has added an additional feature. Renweb now offers a new login page that is linked directly to our website that will have our school code imbedded in the page so you won't have to re-enter the district code each time you visit. This new login page can also remember e-mail addresses in the form of a cookie on a user's computer to make everyday login friendly and easy by only requiring a password. Users can select whether or not they want their email addresses remembered in case multiple users share that computer.

You must first access Renweb directly from our CPLS website at www.cpls.org. (You may find the link under OUTREACH on our home page.) It will direct you to the CPLS log in page. You may then bookmark it in your internet browser for future use.

If you are not at your home computer or if you chose to access Renweb directly at www.renweb.com you will have to enter the district code, email address and password.
